



Especially when it comes to the year 2022, the negatives can seem to overshadow the positives in our lives – both personally and as a community. Inflation is arguably the biggest challenge that we face as a municipality, reflected in cost increases for road projects, pressures from the labor market, and other ripple effects. These big picture issues affect all of you significantly, so maintaining the current residential trash and recycling fee, municipal property tax rate (2.04 mills), and fire protection tax (0.70 mills) in 2023 is critical. On a side note, we ask that you become engaged in our region's ongoing discussions about the future of local EMS services by visiting https://savingemsfornwlancaster.org/. Your feedback is essential.

In light of these fiscal challenges, we are pleased to have completed the Harvest Road reconstruction project. Our Public Works crew will keep chipping away at the difficult Trail Road North widening and repair project while a second segment of this road is repaved next summer. This keeps us on track to complete the Trail Road North project in 2024 and Hereford Road next year. With price uncertainty for road materials in the near future our resources will be directed toward more labor-intensive repairs across Mount Joy Township's road system throughout the course of 2023.

September marked a long-awaited step forward in the Conoy Creek Restoration at Green Meadows as site work recently began. This project accounts for a considerable portion of the required water quality improvements that Mount Joy Township is responsible for. The rest of our pollution reduction allocation will be satisfied by a similar, but larger, project taking place on the Conewago Creek. Big thanks go out to our neighbor and partner Londonderry Township for spearheading this multi-phase restoration project, Lancaster Conservancy for their key role in site acquisition, and multiple funding sources like the Lancaster County Commissioners and Lancaster Clean Water Partners.

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

BE WARM AND SAFE THIS WINTER!

- Keep anything that can burn at least three-feet (one metre) away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot (one metre) "kid-free zone around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month.



Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.

Northwest EMS soon will be sending its annual subscription mailing. This annual appeal is especially important this year as EMS agencies face higher costs while insurance and Medicare reimbursements are not keeping pace. Besides helping Northwest EMS in this unprecedented time, our subscribers may have part or all of the balance on their bill for a 911 response forgiven after we receive insurance reimbursements. PENNSYLVANIA'S SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

Keeping Children Safe

PENNSYLVANIA'S SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

- When you meet or overtake a stopped school bus with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP.
- When you approach an intersection where a school bus is stopped with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP.
- ◆ You MUST STOP at least ten (10) feet away from the school bus.
- You MUST WAIT until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm has been withdrawn before
 moving.
- ◆ DO NOT MOVE until all the children have reached a place of safety.

KNOW YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1.5 million children are transported on Pennsylvania roads each day.
- These children are transported approximately 400 million miles to school each year.
- Every year, children are needlessly injured or killed by drivers passing stopped school buses.



You MUST STOP on roadways with painted lines.



You MUST STOP at an intersection, whether it is or is not marked with a stop sign. All traffic MUST stop.



You MUST STOP on roadways with ridged/grooved dividers.

Fall and Winter Reminders: * Do not place leaves on Township roads, in drainage ditches or over storm drains. If you have a

* If you have a basketball net that hangs over <u>any</u> portion of a Township road, please remove it. It is a hazard for any passing vehicles, including garbage trucks, delivery trucks and, especially, snow plows that need to get close to the curbing.

storm drain in front of your property, please keep it clear of leaves and all debris.

- * When snow falls, please be patient. We will do our best to get a plow truck to your street as quickly as possible. Plowing main arteries will be our first priority, followed by secondary roads and then developments.
- * If you clear your driveway before the street is plowed, do not throw snow into the street. When the plow truck comes by, the snow will inevitably end up back on your property. It is NOT the responsibility of the Township to clear the end of your driveway once the plow has passed through.
- * When a snowstorm is forecast, please remove all vehicles from Township roads so the entire road can be plowed.
- Sidewalks and fire hydrants must be cleared within 24 hours after the end of a snow or ice event.






2023 Rental License


Invoices for the **2023** rental licenses are being sent to property owners in October, 2022. Rental license applications are due to the Township by December 31, 2022. The application can be completed online at www.mtjoytwp.org or sent by US mail to 8853 Elizabethtown Rd., Elizabethtown, PA 17022. Applications can also be dropped off at our office between 8:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday thru Friday or placed in an exterior secure drop box in front of the office 24 hours a day.

Resident Disposal Checklist

- Recycling: We accept the Big 4 at our dropoff containers, which includes 1) corrugated cardboard, 2) plastics with necks, 3) metal food and beverage cans, and 4) glass bottles and jars. Any illegal dumping will be prosecuted.
- Household Hazardous Waste (HHW):
 We accept household chemicals, batteries,
 televisions, computers, and related items
 ONLY at our HHW Facility. Please visit our
 website for a complete list of materials.
- Trash: We accept all forms of household trash, large items, appliances, and tires. See the list below for special instructions related to certain types of waste.



- Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) materials, including televisions and computers, must be taken to the HHW Facility on Harrisburg Pike in Lancaster.
- Asbestos must be delivered directly to the Frey Farm Landfill. Please contact LCSWMA to make arrangements for delivery and disposal.
- Yard Waste is only accepted at the Frey Farm Landfill in Conestoga.
- Sharps must be stored in container (ex: Safe Clip or detergent bottle) and sealed to protect workers. Dispose in your regular trash.

Determine which site to deliver the material:

All LCSWMA facilities accept recycling, trash, remodeling/construction material, appliances, tires, and large items.

Other considerations

- Have you verified the operating hours?
 Each facility offers different hours. Additionally, due to large projects and holidays, times may vary, so it's important to confirm ahead of your visit (717-397-9968 or www.lcswma.org).
- Do you have proper payment ready?
 We accept ONLY credit cards and prepaid cards, not cash or checks.
- Is your truck or trailer tarped?
- Are you prepared to unload your material?
- Are you wearing proper footwear and attire to unload your material? We recommend closed toed shoes and proper clothing to protect yourself during the unloading process.
