The Mount Joy Township Road Improvement Plan



In 2018, the 2019-2023 Road Improvement Plan was adopted to best allocate our Road Projects Fund and Highway Aid money to road restoration and surface management activities. Projects initiated in the last three years have resulted in 2.9 miles of road reconstruction and 3 more miles of widening and repaving. Repairs to Bear Creek Road, Spring Road, and the eastern segment of Beverly Road will be capped off with a paving overlay this summer. Stauffer Road and newly widened Country Squire Road will also be repaired and paved by the Township Public Works Department. Two years later, it is time to assess road improvements for the next five-year period: 2021-2025. The Mill Road bridge replacement should be complete next year, and most of the 2021 and 2022 project dollars have been programmed. Difficult decisions involving project prioritization in years 2023, 2024, and 2025 must be made. This planning process will continue through the spring before a draft plan is proposed to the Board of Supervisors in the summer. Our overarching goal is to make the township's 65 miles of roadway a safe and structurally sound transportation network. Short-Term Lodging Approved

Mount Joy Township adopted an amendment to the Township Zoning Ordinance to allow for and regulate short-term lodging (VRBO, Airbnb, etc.). Essentially, any unit being leased as lodging for a period of less than 30 days is under the short-term lodging (STL) use. This amendment requires:

- An annual permit for each short-term rental unit
- A safety inspection of all short-term rental units once every two years

Applications for a short-term rental license can be obtained from the township or by calling 717-367-8917, ext. 206.



Credit Card Payments Made Online

Now you can pay your trash & recycling bill from the comfort of your home or office by using our online payment service. Credit cards accepted: MasterCard, Discover, American Express or Visa. The account number will be needed. A per-transaction service fee of 2.65% or \$1.50 minimum will be charged by the payment processing company for this service.









Electronic Check Payments

Mount Joy Township now accepts electronic check payments using our online payment service. Payments will be charged to your checking or savings account at your bank. You will need your 9-digit routing number, as well as your account number from your personal checks (see example below). You will also need your trash account number. A per-transaction service fee of \$1.50 will be charged by the payment processing company for this service.

A Message from the Rheems Fire Department...

The Rheems Fire Department would like to emphasize the importance of every home having working smoke/fire detectors. Smoke alarms that are properly installed and maintained play a vital role in reducing fire deaths and injuries. If there is a fire in your home, smoke spreads fast, and you need smoke alarms to give you time to get out. There are numerous types of smoke detection technologies in the market that include ionization and photoelectric smoke detection.

lonization smoke alarms are generally more responsive to flaming fires. They have a small amount of radioactive material

between two electrically charged plates, which ionizes the air and causes current to flow between the plates. When smoke enters the chamber, it disrupts the flow of ions, thus reducing the flow of current and activating the alarm.

Photoelectric smoke alarms are generally more responsive to fires that begin with a long period of smoldering (called "smoldering fires"). Photoelectric-type alarms aim a light source into a sensing chamber at an angle away from the sensor. Smoke enters the chamber, reflecting light onto the light sensor; triggering

The ideal solution is to install "dual sensor" detectors to ensure that you and your family are safe from fire. They are available fully encapsulated, with a 10-year battery life so you never need to worry about changing batteries.

It's important to have enough smoke alarms in your home. For many years, the National Fire Protection Association has required as a minimum that smoke alarms be installed inside every sleep room, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home (larger homes require additional smoke alarms). Homes built to earlier standards often don't meet these minimum requirements. Homeowners should recognize that detection needs have changed over the years and take proactive steps to make sure that every home has a sufficient number of smoke alarms.

Do You Have an Outside Recording Surveillance Camera?

The Northwest Regional Police Department would like the help of the residents in helping solve crimes that may have occurred in or near their neighborhoods.

Detective Frank H. Ember, Jr. and Officer Frank Jones hope to create a directory of MJT residents who have outside recording surveillance cameras. This would provide detectives and officers with a reference directory of locations with outside cameras in the event a crime occurs nearby and is captured on video. The department would then be able to contact the resident with the camera and ask the owner to check if the camera has recorded any video which would help with an investigation.

The police department will not have direct access to any cameras. The owner would only be contacted and asked to check for possible video footage if something would happen in the area. This will significantly increase the ability to solve crimes by locating area cameras quickly. Recorded footage would be beneficial to an investigation.


