- 1. Kevin Baker called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Mount Joy Township Municipal Building located at 8853 Elizabethtown Road, Elizabethtown, PA 17022. The meeting was also broadcast via Zoom for remote attendance and public participation.

- 5. Consent Calendar:
 - a. Approve and ratify the minutes of the April 26, 2021 meeting
 - b. Sign the Lot Line Change Plan for Wenger Feeds, LLC (File #21-01-LLCP)
 - c. Authorize signature of the Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan for Elizabethtown Road Self-Storage, LLC (File #19-14-FLDP)

A motion was made by Lisa Heilner and seconded by Michael McKinne to approve the consent calendar. All members present voted in favor of the motion.

6. Old Business: NONE

7. New Business:

a. <u>Rezoning Petition for Featherton Crossing Phase 5</u> – Review the proposed rezoning ordinance for a 28.271-acre tract of land located on the northern and eastern sides of Merts Drive (Parcel #4600046500000), which would change the zoning designation from MU – Mixed Use District to R-2 – Medium Density Residential District.

Attorney Jill Nagy and land development consultant Scott Sweigart presented the rezoning on behalf of the landowner. Phase 5 is the final phase of the Featherton Crossing development and is currently zoned Mixed Use due to the former plans to relocate the Route 283 offramp into this area. The roadway infrastructure is in place to convey traffic from the new neighborhood back to Campus and Schwanger Roads. Now that the ramp is eliminated, the commercial viability of this site is very minimal.

Mr. McKinne asked whether there is enough demand to support over 1,000 additional dwelling units currently in the pipeline locally? The underlying concern is oversaturation and overbuilding. Mr.

Sweigart noted the overall shift in demand for this type of housing where people can downsize and/or have less property to maintain. A discussion took place regarding roadway connections and the adjacent Messick's site that is up for sale, notably reflecting the change in plans for the Route 283 interchange.

Ms. Heilner asked whether these will be rentals or privately owned. They will likely be private condominium units with private internal streets owned and maintained by a homeowners' association. Township resident Chuck Brewer noted that approximately 1,300 new homes are proposed or under construction in the R-2 zone. Additionally, the increased density has resulted in the loss of open space in the developed area.

A motion was made by Richard Gates and seconded by Michael McKinne to recommend that the Board of Supervisors adopt the rezoning ordinance with the caveat that the resulting development not exceed 190 units as shown on the concept plan.

Mr. McKinne initiated a conversation regarding the long-term outlook on local population projections with respect to the current housing boom and ongoing demographic shifts. Will this glut of housing lead to abandoned properties in future decades as the birth rate and other factors slow down? What happens to private street communities when the homeowners' associations go bankrupt?

- 2. Roll call: Present Karen L. Boyer, Adam Reed and Andrew Treese. Absent William D. Duncan and John L. Felix, Jr.
 - Staff in attendance Patricia J. Bailey, Township Secretary, Justin S. Evans, Township Manager/Zoning Officer, Gerald G. Cole, Township Supervisor and Bryan Range, Parks.
- 3. Public Comment: No public comment was offered at this time.
- 4. Approval and ratification of the minutes of the March 9, 2021 meeting:

A motion was made by Adam Reed and seconded by Andrew Treese to approve the meeting minutes from the March 9, 2021 meeting as written. All members present voted in favor of the motion.

5. Update on Township Parks:

Bryan Range was in attendance and provided an overview of the various parks. He listed items that have been completed as well as projects for the coming months:

Wolgemuth Park:

- Fence repairs
- Will be coating the playground equipment which will prevent fading.
- Removed some benches and tree stumps.
- Replaced rules sign.
- Replaced some parts and added a doggie station.
- Power wash and seal pavilion.

Cove Outlook Park:

- Rejuvenated pathways and added additional stone.
- Pavilion repairs, wash and seal.
- Repairs to fences and areas where there is water runoff.
- Birdhouses donated by the Columbia School District have been installed.
- · Repaired areas that were damaged by vandalism.
- Remove horseshoe pits for lack of use. Would like to see tables or benches be put in that
 area. It would need to be something that is removable.

Old Trolley Line Park:

- Topsoil repairs are needed in several areas.
- Rock work in swales is needed.
- Added a doggie station.
- Repair and level ball fields.
- Added bleachers.

Andrew Treese asked if the Elizabethtown Boys Club would be able to have a designated space to place a pile of dirt so it can be used when needed on the fields. Mr. Range will check it out and be in contact with Mr. Treese.

Had a short discussion on cameras at Old Trolley Line Park. It was originally in the grant and then we found out it would not be covered. It has, for now, been put on the back burner. Will be reevaluated at a later date.

6. Old Trolley Line Park - Grand Opening:

Work continued on planning for the grand opening to be held on Saturday, September 18, 2021. Ms. Bailey provided a list of everything that has been finalized as well as items that may still be needed. A list of additional food trucks was provided. The Board also worked on the invitation and the poster that will be put at all the parks. The invitation list was also reviewed. Discussed how we want to advertise the opening; article or ad in the Merchandiser by late August.

7. Other Business:

Mr. Reed would like to see Disc Golf added to Old Trolley Line Park. It was also suggested to scope out Cove Outlook Park. Mr. Reed will contact Lancaster County Golf Disc Club to see if they would be able to help.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Northwest Regional Lancaster County Police Commission Held on May 25, 2021

- 1) Douglas A. Hottenstein called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M. in the Mount Joy Township Municipal Building, 8853 Elizabethtown Road, Elizabethtown, PA 17022.
- 2) Roll Call: Present Debra E. Dupler; Ralph F. Horne; Eric W. Kreider; David W. Sweigart, III and Douglas A. Hottenstein. Absent: None.
- 3) <u>Executive Session</u> An Executive Session was held prior to this meeting to discuss personnel benefits. Items discussed will be voted on regarding health insurance.
- 4) Public Comment: None.
- 5) Consent Calendar:
 - a) Approval and ratification of the minutes of the April 27, 2021 meeting.
 - b) Accept and ratify the Budget Report for the period of January 1, 2021 through April 30, 2021, subject to audit.
 - c) Approve payment of all bills via Bill List #8-2021 in the amount of \$ 19,087.72; Bill List #9-2021 in the amount of \$41,652.00 and ratify payment of all payrolls for the period of March 26, 2021 through April 22, 2021, inclusive, in the amount of \$ 176,149.04, which represents two (2) pay periods.
 - d) Approve Resolution #03-2021 appointing J. Marc Hershey as Secretary/Treasurer and Lisa S. Heilner as Assistant Secretary/Treasurer.

A motion was made by Debra E. Dupler and seconded by Ralph F. Horne to approve items a. through d. of the Consent Calendar as presented. All other members voted in favor of the motion.

6) Purchase of Police Cruiser:

Chief Mark Mayberry presented the quotes received for a 2021 Dodge Charger indicating the V-8 chargers are not available with all-wheel drive. A V-6 all-wheel drive is available for an additional \$2,000 and recommended staying with a V-8 due to the good track record the Department has had with those vehicles. Durangos cannot be ordered due to a chip shortage. Once ordered, it could take 6 months before it can be added to the fleet. After some discussion, the Commission agreed to the purchase of one cruiser.

A motion was made by Debra E. Dupler and seconded by Ralph F. Horne to approve the purchase of one 2021 Dodge Charger V-8 rear-wheel drive. All other members voted in favor of the motion.

7) Officer of the Year:

Chief Mayberry reported Brad Redinger was voted Officer of the Year and a presentation will be made at the June meeting.

8) Officer Evan Bigler

Chief Mayberry introduced Officer Samuel Evan Bigler to the Commissioners. Officer Bigler grew up in Millersville and was previously a police officer with Elizabethtown Borough. Chief Mayberry reported Officer Bigler started last Monday and is ready to be on his own.

9) Plaque in Memory of Richard Forry

Chief Mayberry noted what a huge asset and supporter for the Police Department Richard Forry had been and requested permission to place a plaque in the lobby commemorating his memory and dedication. The Commission agreed.

10) Scholarship - NWRP Association

Officer Aaron McCoy presented information to the Commission on a scholarship funded by the Northwest Regional Police Association. The scholarship is for anyone living within the Townships, graduating from high school and has an interest in a law enforcement career. This year the scholarship was offered through the NWRPD website as well as the Township's websites. Officer Frank Jones presented the 2021 Northwest Regional Police Officer Association Scholarship to Olivia Hauck. Ms. Hauck is graduating from Elizabethtown High School, is interested in pursuing a law enforcement career and will be attending LaSalle University in the fall.

11) Benecon

A motion was made by David W. Sweigart, III and seconded by Ralph F. Horne to enter into a 42-month agreement waiving the 90-day waiting period with Benecon contingent upon approval by the Northwest Regional Police Association with an initial rate in effect from July 1, 2021 to December 31, 2022, and further designating the Secretary/Treasurer as an authorized individual to sign the necessary insurance documents. All other members voted in favor of the motion.

12) Resolution #04-2021

Mr. Marc Hershey indicated a resolution needs to be approved by the Commission to join with other political subdivisions as a member of the Intergovernmental Insurance Cooperative.

A motion was made by Debra E. Dupler and seconded by Eric Kreider to adopt Resolution No. 04-2021 approving joining with other political subdivisions as a member of the Intergovernmental Insurance Cooperative. All other members voted in favor of the motion.

13) Designated Signatories - Benecon/IIC Trust

Mr. Hershey reported the Commission needs a designation of at least two individuals as signatories for the related insurance Benecon/Intergovernmental Insurance Cooperative Trust account.

A motion was made by David W. Sweigart, III and seconded by Eric W. Kreider appoint Debra E. Dupler, Lisa S. Heilner, Marc Hershey and Mark E. Mayberry as designated signatories of the Benecon/Intergovernmental Insurance Cooperative Trust account. All other members voted in favor of the motion.

14) Modified Cash Basis Accounting

Mr. Hershey indicated this item was tabled at the April meeting and continues to recommend a modified cash basis accounting with the modification being adjusting the Accrual Absence Fund calculating vacation and sick time banks accruing for the liability of those accounts. EAWA WORK SESSION MEETING MINUTES JUNE 2, 2021 - 6:30 PM

- 1. CALL TO ORDER: The EAWA Board meeting was called to order at 6:30 P.M. by Dale Treese, Chairman. Members present: Jeff McCloud, Rich Sheidy, Keith Murphy, Rick Erb, Chuck Brewer and John O'Connell. Also present were: Del Becker, Authority Manager; Jason Bock, Operations Manager; Cindy Zawrotuk, Engineer, and George Alspach, Solicitor. Not present: Michele Powl, Business Manager; and Donna Bissinger, Admin Assistant. Members of the Public: None
- 2. PUBLIC COMMENT: None.
- 3. REPORTS:
 - a. Manager's Report:
 - i. TTHM MCL Exceedance: Becker and Bock briefed the Board on the May 18,2021 violation of exceeding the TTHM MCL at the clearwell location at the Old Plant. The current annual moving average is 86 parts per billion, exceeding the limit of 80 ppb, resulting in a Tier 2 violation. For such violations, DEP requires that EAWA notify all customers by direct mail and public notices. As a result, EAWA must increase monitoring for the TTHMs and conduct a system wide evaluation within 90 days. Becker indicated that a third-party should do the evaluation and recommended that GHD conduct the evaluation. Becker wanted to be clear that EAWA's water was not unsafe but had exceeded the limit for long-term exposure. The Board inquired how this had happened. Bock indicated that it was likely a combination of unusual water conditions this summer and chlorination of that water. Becker stated that the language in the notice was required by DEP and could not be modified. Murphy suggested that dredging of the reservoir be considered. Due to increased demand, Bock indicated that the plant is needed daily. Becker said the notice would be mailed and posted next week.
 - ii. Water Rates: Becker presented to the Board a memo on the historical information regarding water rates. He indicated that for the most part the base rate structure has not changed since Authority formation. The impact of providing fire service on water rates was also discussed. Where fire service is provided, a direct connection to the water main is preferred. O'Connell stated that previous discussions had focused on costs associated with routine costs of maintaining the distributions system, the impact of recent and proposed multi-unit housing where fire service is required by code and the concept of municipalities being billed for fire service. The third component would be the most difficult to implement. For the next adjustment in rates, the rate analysis will include fire service rates including a separate fee for properties that have fire service connections where appropriate. Becker advised that the method that EAWA bills for water service differs from the rate structure typical of other authorities and utilities. Treese stated that at this moment in time, pending legislation regarding multi-unit properties will dictate that EAWA needs to be proactive and revise the rate structure and avoid being boxed

into a corner. He indicated that communication with the customers is the most important aspect and to inform them well in advance of the rate structure change. Becker stated that setting up the model needed for the rate study would be an extensive effort and that should the Board not want to revise that the structure that the effort should not be expended on analysis that would not be used. O'Connell reviewed a typical rate structure that includes a base charge and a consumption charge that does not include an included amount of water but the customer pays for all water consumed. Treese asked the Board if there was direction to move in this direction and the Board agreed. Becker also provided the Board with a projection of potential customer growth in the service area. Treese asked whether the proposed growth was within that planned and Becker indicated that it was.

- b. Operations Manager's Report: Bock reviewed his report with the Board and repairs that were needed on Willow Street and Harrisburg Avenue. Well No. 5 experienced a sudden drop in output. The pump was pulled and pipe column directly above the pump had a large hole. The pump was replaced and placed back into service and output of the well returned to the normal range. The existing pump will be refurbished and kept as a spare.
- c. Engineer's Report: Zawrotuk provided a review of projects in design and construction. the tapping fee calculation. The preliminary tapping fee calculation indicates an increase of approximately \$480 is supportable. Becker indicated an increase in that amount would provide additional revenue for capital projects. She indicated that the final calculation will be available for the July work session meeting. Zawrowtuk also indicated they were moving forward with the analysis for the Tier 2 violation.

The posting had already triggered customers to true up their accounts. He indicated that both our employees and customers needed to relearn the process because of the pandemic.


